About your project		
Please provide details of the project and how the project will benefit the people of Lowestoft (250 words max).	The Heritage Open Days annual national festival takes place across the UK each September. It is the countries largest heritage festival established in 1994. Heritage buildings open their doors and allow free public access, in 2017 some 17 buildings in Lowestoft took part as well as as 2 historical displays. The 2018 event is now being planned with the intention of expanding the number of buildings to open in Lowestoft and by increasing the number of heritage related events to take place around the town during the festival period of 6 <sup>th</sup> to 9 <sup>th</sup> and 13 <sup>th</sup> to 16 <sup>th</sup> of September 2018. In 2017 in excess of 2000 visits occurred during the 4 days of the festival as the event has this year been increased to 8 days it is envisaged that visitor numbers will increase. The festival helps install pride in the town's historic environment and is beneficial for both tourism and local businesses. It is an event that can be enjoyed by all members of the community and all ages. The event is FREE to the public making all parts of it accessible to all.

### **HOD Lowestoft Group**

- 1. Name: the name of the group shall be the Heritage Open Days (Lowestoft) Steering Group (the Group)
- 2. Aim: to facilitate and co-ordinate the celebration of the national Heritage Open Days Festival within Lowestoft and district.
- 3. Membership: is initially by invitation but is open to all with an interest in promoting the aim of the Group.

### 4. Governance:

- a. the Group will be governed by a Management Committee consisting of a minimum of eight members.
- b. the members will elect a Chairman, Vice Chairman and Secretary/Treasurer and any other officer posts deemed necessary who will form the executive core of the Group.
- c. each member of the Group will have one vote but the Chairman will have an additional casting vote in the event of equality of votes cast.
- d. additional members may be co-opted to the Management Committee. The number will be limited to half of those elected but they will have the same voting rights as an elected member. Subsidiary groups may be formed to carry out specific tasks as required.
- e. a quorum will be achieved by the presence of half of the members of the committee. Proposals will be carried by a simple majority of votes cast (subject to 4c above).
- f. any proposal to amend the Constitution must submitted in writing to the Secretary in advance to be circulated to all members 7 days before the meeting at which it is to be proposed. A simple majority is required for it to be carried.
- 5. Administration: The Secretary is responsible for maintaining a record of the minutes of meetings, of the members names and their contact details. The Treasurer is responsible for recording the movement of the Group's funds and for opening a bank account in the Group's name. At least two signatories will be required to authorise a payment from the Group's account.
- **6. E&OE:** In the event that a matter arises with regard to the governance of the Group that is not specifically covered by the Constitution then it will be resolved by a majority vote of the Management Committee.

### Dear Sir or Madam

May I introduce myself. My name is Paul King, I'm a Lowestoft resident. I have a keen interest in our town's heritage and architecture and have for several years enjoyed a national free event called 'Heritage Open Days'. This event takes place annually each September in many villages, towns and cities throughout the country. It's by far the UK's largest heritage festival and this year's event will take place between the 6th to 9th and 13th to 16th of September. Briefly, the event is designed to promote heritage in all its forms as well as architecture by opening up buildings which are normally closed to the general public by offering free access.

Our town of Lowestoft has, unfortunately for the most part, ignored the event in recent years and I, with others, are trying to change that as we strongly believe the event could be of great benefit to the town, as well as helping to promote tourism and other related businesses. Lowestoft has a wealth of historic, beautiful, and indeed interesting, buildings that have the potential to be included and involved. We believe your premises in Lowestoft is one such building. This could be a wonderful opportunity to allow the public to have a look around an important, beautiful and interesting building that forms part of our town's heritage. In addition it helps you to promote your building/organisation and enables you to achieve free nationwide publicity as well as helping to install a greater sense of pride in our historic environment.

I began to promote this event in Lowestoft in 2017 and was delighted when 17 historic buildings around the town and 2 history displays agreed to participate. The event was a great success and attracted over 2000 visits during the festival period. A formal Steering Group has now been set up to help to promote and organise the 2018 festival and build on the success of last year's event. The Steering Group aim to coordinate the event locally and to publish a 'What's On' Festival Guide that will be free to visitors and will include details of all host events taking part. We also aim to promote the festival locally by way of press and social media coverage.

We were wondering therefore whether you would be willing to consider taking part in the event. We are pleased to confirm that several buildings in the town are already planning to join in again, including thus far, the Old Town Hall, several museums and churches, theatres along with numerous other historical premises in the High Street and around the town. We are currently working through a list of further buildings with a view to contacting them and encouraging them to join in, if not for this year, then for future years. In addition we are planning several heritage related events to take place during the festival including concerts, displays, walks and such like.

In order to take part you would need to register your building with www.heritageopendays.org.uk. It's a fairly simple process and once registered they will advertise your involvement on their website and in other publicity as well as send you upon request free publicity material to help you promote your event, such as flags, bunting, stickers, posters, balloons & banners etc.

## heritage open days

How and when you open during the event is entirely a matter for you. Some buildings open for all of the days whereas others select one or two particular days. You can choose to have general open access at specific times or perhaps limit numbers to guided tours at particular times which could be pre booked. The only proviso is that the event should be free of charge and that some information about the history of the building, its heritage and or its architectural features is available perhaps by means of a simple typed flyer. The choice is really yours. Often the building's owners or their representatives are on hand to answer questions or provide some information about the building's history. The organisation offers free public liability insurance should that be required. Myself or members of the Steering Group are happy to meet with you to discuss how you can become involved, help with your event and if requested even register your event on the national website. We are in contact and work with the Heritage Open Days national organisation.

If you are interested in taking this matter forward and helping to promote Lowestoft by getting it well and truly on the national heritage map, then we would be delighted to hear from you. We have also created a Facebook group called 'Lowestoft Heritage & Architectural Appreciation Group' which is used to help coordinate and promote the event. We also have our own 'Heritage Open Days - Lowestoft' Facebook page. If I or any of our Steering Group members can in any way assist or provide further information, please don't hesitate to contact us. It would be great to hear from you and get to know your views on the matter in any event. Thank you for taking the time to read this.
