Planning Policy and Delivery Team

Update on the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan Examination

The Government are encouraging local authorities to continue preparing their Local Plans.

Having now responded to the issues raised in the Planning Inspector's post Examination Hearings letter dated 31 January 2020, the Council will shortly be in a position to announce the timetable and arrangements for the consultation on the Inspector's proposed Main Modifications to the Local Plan, taking into account the current Covid 19 restrictions relating to social distancing. The Council's responses to the issues raised in the Inspector's letter will be published, for information, alongside the consultation.

Neighbourhood Planning Support

The Planning Policy and Delivery team are available to support you with your neighbourhood plan. Staff can be contacted via email and on the telephone. You can email your normal contacts or use planningpolicy@eastsuffolk.gov.uk. Some staff may need to work slightly different hours to normal at times, but if you wish to discuss something we will arrange a mutually convenient time to do so. Please note we will not be scheduling any face-to-face meetings for the time being.

Covid-19 arrangements for planning applications

These emergency procedures delegating all decision making to the Head of Planning and Coastal Management are temporary until such time as the council implements procedures for remote working. The government published the Regulations to enable this to happen last week and there are ongoing discussions as to how they will be implemented at East Suffolk Council including how we will deliver Planning Committee meetings. When the procedures have been established and all the IT necessary to ensure the meetings will work we will inform everyone of how and when they will begin.

Making a Planning Application

The most efficient way to make your planning application is through the Planning Portal, no delays and easy payment systems are available. The best possible way to keep the paperwork flowing. We still do accept paper copies, but please bear in mind with all officers working remotely, this will delay the receipt and registration of your planning application.

Making your Planning Submission easier

When submitting a planning application, if you are able to include photographs of the site please consider doing so. Our planning officers are not currently making site visits due to strict protocols in place, and we want to offer the same great service. The more assistance you are able to provide our team with to understand your proposals the smoother and quicker it will make the consideration of your application.

Parish E-consultation

Live from 1 April. If you haven't taken the opportunity to register, please do so now and don't miss out on your electronic documents. If you need assistance please send an email to planning@eastsuffolk.gov.uk and we will get you started.

EIR search process is electronic as of 1st April 2020. Any Information you cannot find yourself through our site, please submit your personnel search through the EIR/FOI process.

Using Public Access and the Planning Portal for answers

All staff within the planning applications team are working remotely to adhere to the current protocol for social distancing. We are still operating a Duty Officer service accessible via dutyplanner@eastsuffolk.gov.uk, but please bear in mind it is likely to take us a bit longer to be able to deal with your query. However, did you know, most of your common questions can be answered by visiting the Planning Portal (www.planningportal.co.uk) or the Council's website (www.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/planning). If you have any queries regarding a current planning application please direct those to the case officer as identified on your consultation letter or on the website.

Our customer services team would be happy to take your payment for your Planning, Building Control or Land Charge Search requests. Please ensure you have all your details to hand that will allow them to direct your payment to the correct area without delay. E.g. application number, address, name, site address.

Enforcement

We are continuing to provide an enforcement service, officers are only able to undertake site inspections in emergencies and we will visit sites subject to being confident we can adhere to the government guidance on social distancing to ensure the well being of staff. There may therefore be a delay in resolving the matter or providing clarification to you, but we will still log and progress the matter where possible. Building Control

Site Inspections

During this unprecedented time, the Building Control department alongside neighbouring Authorities have decided to temporarily suspend all inspection duties other than those deemed as emergency site inspections or dangerous structures to avoid unnecessary contact.

Our primary focus is on the wellbeing of staff and the public, as a team we feel we have a responsibility to demonstrate safe practice and reduce encouragement for unnecessary activity or gatherings on active building sites.

To minimise impact for those choosing to continue building works we have offered an inspection service which is case-by-case where we 'may' accept photographic evidence as a physical inspection alternative if we deem it to be of limited risk and appropriate. All surveyors are offering over the phone advice and support, once again demonstrating the business as usual approach.

All inspection enquiries/requests will remain directed to the appropriate area surveyor.

All surveyors remain in direct contact with the support team (who have been exceptional!) to facilitate prompt and reliable administrative services.

We have seen several completion certificates requests and general property queries arise as people take stock at home and pull property records together.

Dangerous Structure Duties

Safety is our priority and our Dangerous Structures duties will remain in place to protect the public. Health and safety precautions will be considered upon attending any dangerous structure working alongside emergency services. All reports of dangerous structure duties will be dealt with by Mark Harvey, Bob Griffin or Michael Charlton.







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Energy Projects

Sizewell C new nuclear power station:

The Joint Local Authority Group between East Suffolk Council and Suffolk County Council, recently sent out a news-letter detailing the current position with regards to the Sizewell C project, (attached/ https://www.eastsuffolk.gov.uk/planning/sizewell-c-joint-local-authority-group/sizewell-c-monthly-updates/sizewell-c-monthly-updates-2020/). Within the newsletter, reference is made to the joint Leader's statement in relation to the proposed delay in submission by EDF Energy. We continue and welcome discussions with EDF Energy on future timescales for submission of their application for a development consent order.


East Anglia One North and East Anglia Two offshore wind farm proposals:

Having regard to the current public health situation surrounding Covid-19, the Preliminary Meeting and Hearings scheduled for 24 – 26 March 2020 were postponed by the Planning Inspectorate. There has been no revised timeline published to date and we wait for further announcements from the Planning Inspectorate. In the meantime, officers are continuing to work on our Local Impact Report and responses to initial questions tabled by the Examining Authority (Planning Inspectorate).

Other energy projects in East Suffolk:

Although we have been engaging in early pre application discussions regarding the international interconnector projects and Galloper extension, these are currently on hold, at the request of the developers, due to the impending examination into the East Anglia One North and East Anglia Two windfarms. We are aware of future projects affecting East Suffolk including the potential for a domestic interconnector, but discussions are not currently active at this time.
