The project supplies Lowestoft Foodbank, an approved Community Partner, with hygiene products on a monthly basis who in turn distribute them to their clients free of charge when they collect food and other essentials.
Currently there are between a 1000 to 1300 clients per month attending and this is often the first place people will go when in crisis. Funding allows the project to purchase additional products to cover the shortfall in public donations. Currently, donations are fewer whilst the need ever increasing. Funding also allows us to purchase products that aren't typically donated, such as nappies and period products.
Hygiene poverty is uniquely oppressive; inhibiting and restricting people's ability to engage in opportunities to lift them out of poverty because they feel unclean and lack confidence. When essential hygiene needs are met individuals can participate in local activities, seek employment, training, education or work, their self esteem is restored and see a reduction in physical and mental health problems.
The provision of these items again lessens financial burdens on people who are experiencing poverty and having to make choices between purchasing, food, fuel, clothes and products to keep adults and children clean.
£3,600
All funding will be used solely to purchase personal hygiene products and nappies on a monthly basis. At present £300 per month is needed to top up the public donations and cover the shortfall and provide a regular tailored supply.
£1,600 for 2025/6 Previous funding has been provided via the Food Network Bids.
